Para Dressage ABC's Steps to get started in Para Dressage:

A. Classification

To compete in Para Dressage you will need to be classified: Classification information may be found HERE.

- Apply to request a National Classification through USEF Para Equestrian Director, Laureen Johnson at Ikjohnson@usef.org, 908-997-3008.
- Application must be submitted 6 weeks prior to classification event and must include:
 - a. The USEF Classification Request Form;
 - b. Completed and signed USEF Consent for Classification;
 - c. USEF Medical Diagnostic Form and any additional supporting medical documentation;
 - d. USEF VI Medical Diagnostic Form (For Visually Impaired Athletes).
- After documentation has been reviewed by chief classifier and if athlete meets eligibility criteria a classification date will be set. (If request is not approved the reason(s) will be provided)

B. Training

- Search for a barn near you
 - a. that is a designated USEF Center of Excellence (COE) to help you and your trainer. COE Directory may be found <u>HERE</u>;
 - b. Alternatively, USEF has a list of Para Dressage coaches. Coach Directory may be found HERE. > You can train at a trainer's barn of your choice;
 - c. Have current trainer attend a USEF Para Dressage Coaches Clinic.
