<h2>Bridle / Nosebands / Reins</h2>		
<p>All items of saddlery used must align with the FEI Dressage Rules articles 427 and 428 or FEI Para Dressage Rules articles 8427 and 8428.</p>		
<p>The bit can be attached to the reins and cheek pieces only</p>		
<p>Noseband check:</p> <p>Dressage Rules art 428.2.1.5 / Para Dressage Rules art 8428.1.2.9:</p> <p>At any level of competition, a noseband may never be so tightly fixed that it causes harm to the horse and must be checked as per the Stewards Manual noseband protocol. If it happens again the rider should receive a yellow card for not following the instruction of the steward.</p> <p>Stewards Manual Dressage Annex IX / Stewards Manual Para Dressage Annex V</p> <p>In case of an apparent overtightened noseband during the horse's warm-up, the appointed tack control steward is entitled to conduct the check also during the warm-up and, in case of the noseband being overtightened, ask the athlete to loosen the noseband. The noseband of the horse will be checked again by the same steward after the horse has finished the test. If the noseband is still too tight after the second check, the Chief Steward will give a Yellow Warning Card to the athlete.</p>





Elastic Insert

Elastic Concept for rein and cheek piece by PS of Sweden

Here we have attached a durable and strong elastic band that is attached to the leather. The elastic touches **NEVER** the bit. The elastic helps the bit to be a little bit flexible and more dynamic in the mouth.



Elastic is placed up here on the cheek piece and is hidden under the keeper.

The bit will only and always be in contact with leather, never anything else.

PS of Sweden, 7th of March 2017

Elastic insert are permitted in the crownpiece and cheek pieces only and must not be in direct contact with the Horse or the bit.



Rein Attachments



A rein is a continuous, uninterrupted strap or line from the bit to the hand. Rein additions or attachments are not allowed.










Bits

- Diameter of bits
The diameter of the mouthpiece is measured adjacent to the rings or the cheeks of the mouthpiece (Dressage Rules art 428.3, Para Dressage Rules art 8428.1.3)
Curb – minimum diameter to be twelve millimetres (12mm)
Bridoons – minimum diameter to be ten millimetres (10mm)
Snaffles – minimum diameter to be twelve millimetres (12mm) for horses and ten millimetres (10mm) for ponies
Note: The diameter should not be measured systematically but in case of doubt
- Curb Lever Arm (Dressage Rules art 428.3.3.1, Para Dressage Rules art 8428.1.3.3.1)
The length of the lever arm below the mouthpiece of the curb bit is limited to ten centimetres (10 cm). The upper cheek must not be longer than the lower cheek. If the curb has a sliding mouthpiece, the lever arm of the curb bit below the mouthpiece should not measure more than ten centimetres (10 cm) when the mouthpiece is at the uppermost position.




Ear hoods are permitted for all Events and may also provide noise reduction. However, ear hoods must not cover the horse's eyes and ear plugs are not permitted, with the exception of Horse Inspections and prize-giving ceremonies. The ear hoods should be discreet in colour and design. Ear hoods may not be attached to the noseband.


